Neurosurgery is meaningful work, and each year, we learn about promising research and continued advancements in the field.

The **Neurosurgery Research & Education Foundation** (NREF) has been opening doors to **future breakthroughs** and providing young neurosurgeons with a **springboard to success** for over forty years. Over 30 percent of NREF resident grant recipients go on to receive NIH funding and nearly 20 percent are chairs of academic departments.

Our impact on career trajectories also extends to medical students. A study of **NREF Medical Student Summer Research Fellowship** applicants and awardees, recently published in the [Journal of Neurosurgery](#), found that the program results in a high percentage of “awardees pursuing neurosurgery and matching into top-ranked residency programs.” Furthermore, awardees that go on to academic neurosurgery programs receive subsequent NIH funding at a ratio of \$1:\$9. The ROI is undeniable: The MSSRF is cultivating the next generation of neurosurgeons and fostering future success by providing these medical students with valuable experience, mentorship and organizational support.

Collectively, through the NREF, we have the power to **light the way for neurosurgeons**.

I am proud of the fact that we have maintained our emphasis on research in the training of young neurosurgeons.
